

Dear Padre Pio, mammagra anol aids and When someone writes to you as superior and spiritual director you should listen with reverence and interior submission to what he says and not continue to think over it with a kind of resentment.

As your superior and director I have told you that your illness does not require doctors, since it is due to a special permission of God. For this reason I have not cared to have you examined by any specialist. If I had thought differently I should have made those sacrifices for you which not only the other Orders but also our own Order is capable of bearing for the benefit of its subjects. How am I to begin this letter: with a cry of pain or a hymn of praise to my God?

I often think, my dearest Father, that there is only one thing which pierces the heart when we thing which pierces the heart when we see ourselves far from God, the source and consolation of distressed souls. That God, the god is solitude, for here the soul enjoys sweet rest in the One who is its true peace.

But alas! Only too often, Father, the soul is prevented from enjoying him with complete freedom! Who can from then, the intense pain this person experiences? His mind is almost carried away by contemplation of the marvels of his divine Spouse; his will, on the other hand, is deeply afflicted, for it does not want to be withdrawn or disturbed in any way in its enjoyment of that love which it fails to understand, a love which bears no resemblance whatever to the love usually felt for creatures.

His poor will understands nothing of this mystery; it loves with a greater love than it has ever known and here, in fact, arises the immense torment which gives the soul no

peace either night or day.

The soul burns with desire to know the object of its love, but the incomprehensible abyss of the divine immensity oppresses it, overwhelms and annihilates it. It feels itself reduced to nothingness, and like the Prophet it can raise its voice and give vent to its anguish with the tormentor of souls: I am reduced to nothingness 1.

The heart ardently yearns to enjoy the supreme beauty of God's countenance, but in vain, for it sees itself bound by

a harsh chain, imprisoned in this despicable world. Yes, indeed, my dear Father, for the wretched soul that

has fallen into such a trap it seems as if everything fights against its love. For this reason I myself feel my spiritual tor, ment increased a thousandfold and even when my soul is rapt in intimate colloquy with God, I suffer cruel torment, for my thoughts go out to the great number of those who are not in the least concerned about these heavenly delights, and to the many unfortunates who through their own fault will be deprived for all eternity of tasting even a drop of this bliss.

Then it is that my soul, resting in God, feels such a great aversion for this repose that I almost faint, for I would willingly sacrifice the delights of my soul's repose if I might hope to enkindle in other hearts the desire for this happiness which makes one blessed.

I cannot understand how it is that this rest generates such torment in one who desires nothing else than to please God, our Father and Creator.

Perhaps I am under a wretched illusion in seeing so clearly that God is present in the depths of my heart! My dear Father, who is to assure me with all certainty that I am not separated from this most tender Spouse of souls? Alas! How hard life is, what a torment, how bitter it is to be kept up to the last breath in continual uncertainty as regards what it is most important to know in this wretched exile!

I do not see who can desire this life in which the only consolation, that of pleasing God in all things, is so uncertain and exposed to so many dangers! But what am I saying? I realize that I am raving in the full light of day. Yes, life can be desired and it is made for strong souls, but not for my complain to my God and to ask him to hasten the dissolving of this body of death.



Saint Francis of Assisi's Story

The patron saint of Italy, Saint Francis of Assisi was a poor little man who astounded and inspired the Church by taking the gospel literally - not in a narrow fundamentalist sense, but by actually following all that Jesus said and did, joyfully, without limit, and without a sense of self-importance.

Serious illness brought the young Saint Francis to see the emptiness of his frolicking life as leader of Assisi's youth. Prayer—lengthy and difficult—led him to a self-emptying like that of Christ, climaxed by embracing a leper he met on the road. It symbolized his complete obedience to what he had heard in prayer: "Francis! Everything you have loved and desired in the flesh it is your duty to despise and hate, if you wish to know my will. And when you have begun this, all that now seems sweet and lovely to you will become intolerable and bitter, but all that you used to avoid will turn itself to great sweetness and exceeding joy."

From the cross in the neglected field-chapel of San Damiano, Christ told him, "Francis, go out and build up my house, for it is nearly falling down." Francis became the totally poor and humble workman. He must have suspected a deeper meaning to "build



up my house." But he would have been content to be for the rest of his life the poor "nothing" man actually putting brick on brick in abandoned chapels. He gave up all his possessions, piling even his clothes before his earthly father—who was demanding restitution for Francis' "gifts"

to the poor—so that he would be totally free to say, "Our Father in heaven." Saint Francis was, for a time, considered to be a religious fanatic, begging from door to door when he could not get money for his work, evoking sadness or disgust to the hearts of his former friends, ridicule from the unthinking.

But genuineness will tell. A few people began to realize that this man was actually trying to be Christian. He really believed what Jesus said: "Announce the kingdom! Possess no gold or silver or copper in your purses, no traveling bag, no sandals, no staff" (Luke 9:1-3). Saint Francis of Assisi's first rule for his followers was a collection of texts from the Gospels.

Saint Francis of Assisi's first rule for his followers was a collection of texts from the Gospels. He had no intention of founding an order, but once it began, he protected it and accepted all the legal structures needed to support it. His devotion and loyalty to the Church were absolute and highly exemplary at a time when various movements of reform tended to break the Church's unity.

Saint Francis of Assisi was torn between a life devoted entirely to prayer and a life of active preaching of the Good News. He decided in favor of the latter but always returned to solitude when he could. He wanted to be a missionary in Syria or in Africa but was prevented by shipwreck and illness in both cases. He did try to convert Sultan Malik al-Kamil during the Fifth Crusade.

During the last years of his relatively short life, he died at 44, Francis was half blind and seriously ill. Two years before his death he received the stigmata, the real and painful wounds of Christ in his hands, feet and side.

On his deathbed, Saint Francis of Assisi said over and over again the last addition to his *Canticle of the Sun*, "Be praised, O Lord, for our Sister Death." He sang Psalm 141, and at the end asked his superior's permission to have his clothes removed when the last hour came in order that he could expire lying naked on the earth, in imitation of his Lord.

### Reflection

Saint Francis of Assisi was poor only that he might be Christ-like. He recognized creation as another manifestation of the beauty of God. In 1979, he was named patron of ecology. He did great penance—apologizing to "Brother Body" later in life—that he might be totally disciplined for the will of God. Francis' poverty had a sister, Humility, by which he meant total dependence on the good God. But all this was, as it were, preliminary to the heart of his spirituality: living the gospel life, summed up in the charity of Jesus and perfectly expressed in the Eucharist.



# A letter of St Maximilian Kolbe We must sanctify the whole world.

I rejoice greatly, dear brother, at the outstanding zeal that drives you to promote the glory of God. It is sad to see how in our times the disease called "indifferentism" is spreading in all its forms, not just among those in the world but also among the members of religious orders. But indeed, since God is worthy of infinite glory, it is our first and most pressing duty to give him such glory as we, in our weakness, can manage – even though we would never, poor exiled creatures that we are, be able to render him such glory as he truly deserves.

Because God's glory shines through most brightly in the salvation of the souls that Christ redeemed with his own blood, let it be the chief concern of the apostolic life to bring



salvation and an increase in holiness to as many souls as possible. Let me briefly outline the best way to achieve this end – both for the glory of God and for the sanctification of the greatest number. God, who is infinite knowledge and infinite wisdom, knows perfectly what is to be done to give him glory, and in the clearest way possible makes his will known to us through his vicegerents on Earth.

It is obedience and obedience alone that shows us God's will with certainty. Of course, our superiors may err, but it cannot happen that we, holding fast to our obedience, should be led into error by this. There is only one exception: if the superior commands something that would obviously involve breaking God's law, however slightly. In that case the superior could not be acting as a faithful interpreter of God's will.

God himself is the one infinite, wise, holy, and merciful Lord, our Creator and our Father, the beginning and the end, wisdom, power, and love – God is all these. Anything that is apart from God has value only in so far as it is brought back to him, the Founder of all things, the Redeemer

of mankind, the final end of all creation. Thus, he himself makes his holy will known to us through his vice-gerents on Earth and draws us to himself, and through us – for so he has willed – draws other souls too, and unites them to himself with an ever more perfect love.

See then, brother, the tremendous honour of the position that God in his kindness has placed us in. Through obedience we transcend our own limitations and align ourselves with God's will, which, with infinite wisdom and prudence, guides us to do what is best. Moreover, as we become filled with the divine will, which no created thing can resist, so we become stronger than all others.

This is the path of wisdom and prudence; this is the one way by which we can come to give God the highest glory. After all, if there had been another, better way, Christ would certainly have shown it to us, by word and by example. But in fact, sacred Scripture wraps up his entire long life in Nazareth with the words *and he was obedient to them* and it shows the rest of his life to have been passed in similar obedience – almost as an instruction to us – by showing how he came down to Earth to do the Father's will.

Brethren, let us love him above all, our most loving heavenly Father, and let our obedience be a sign of this perfect love, especially when we have to sacrifice our own wills in the process. And as for a book from which to learn how to grow in the love of God, there is no better book than Jesus Christ crucified.

All this we will achieve more easily through the intercession of the Immaculate Virgin, to whom the most kind God has given the task of dispensing his mercies. There is no doubt that the will of Mary should be the will of God for us. When we dedicate ourselves to him, we become tools in her hands just as she became a tool in his. Let us let her direct us and lead us by the hand. Let us be calm and serene under her guidance: she will foresee all things for us, provide all things, swiftly fulfil our needs both bodily and spiritual, and keep away from us all difficulty and suffering.
